Interested teachers need only attend one of the workshops where they will receive free classroom curriculum supplies and energy conservation kits for up to 30 students. At this time teachers will be trained to present seven simple but timely energy activities with five corresponding home activities.



Free teacher supplies include a "Kill-A-Watt" meter, Dynamo flashlight, energy ball, low-flow showerhead, kitchen and bathroom faucet aerators, outlet gaskets, night light, compact fluorescent light bulb, hot water gauge, LCD thermostat thermometer, refrigerator thermometer, water flow measuring device and others. Each of the thirty free individual student kits includes all of the energy efficiency supplies shown above. In addition, teachers can receive CFLs (compact fluorescent lightbulbs) for all of their students, even beyond the thirty kits.
